CIT (COUNSELLOR-IN-TRAINING) PROGRAM 2010

LIMITED ENROLLMENT

This unique program is offered to a limited number of young people in their 16th year who have completed grade 10.

LIVING ARRANGEMENTS

An exclusive Village located in an ideal area of camp is the home of our CIT's. CIT's are not assigned to work with one specific age group but will have the opportunity to interact with several different Units during the summer. This will provide a more comprehensive CIT experience and also allow close friends to continue living together.

CABIN & SPECIALTY ROTATIONS

Each CIT will have 2 rotations in camper cabins and 2 on activity areas. The rotations will include a cabin placement in two of the following units: BB/Bear, Eagle, Senior, Grad or PeeGee Units. In addition 2 specialty rotations chosen by the CIT will occur in conjunction with their cabin/unit assignment throughout the summer.

LECTURES, DISCUSSIONS & SEMINARS

The CIT Coordinator and Wahanowin senior staff will hold lectures, discussions and seminars on various topics for CIT's which will add more dimension to the practical hands-on experience they receive.

SUPERVISION & GUIDANCE

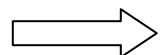
The CIT Coordinator, Unit Heads, Head Counsellor and Camp Directors offer on going supervision and guidance to CIT's in their "jobs" as well as personal growth areas.

EXCURSIONS

The CIT's will take "special" excursions and spend time together on supervised trips to the beautiful and picturesque Killarney Provincial Park, Wasaga Beach, outings to Orillia and Canada's Wonderland. A highlight of every CIT's summer is the amazing White Water Rafting trip on the Ottawa River.

PRE-CAMP TRAINING

All CIT's must attend our Staff Pre-Camp Training Program prior to the Campers' arrival. The first major excursion of the summer occurs during pre-camp; the three day Killarney Canoe Trip. This is the opportunity for CIT's to work together at forming strong bonds, positive interactions and creating the teamwork necessary to establish a successful unit. Program highlights, scheduling and the first seminar will also be covered during this trip.



ADDITIONAL ASPECTS OF THE PROGRAM

The CIT's will be involved in a variety of additional programs which will include; CIT/10 Year Friday Night Service, CIT/Staff Play, exclusive CIT Banquet & Awards Dinner, Planning and organizing the Camp-wide Closing Banquet, CIT Intercamp Sports teams and leagues, all Staff Programming and Staff Curfew, plus many more "perks" and special events.

CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

The CIT Code of Behaviour is based on Staff Rules and Regulations. In particular, CIT's may not keep or consume drugs or alcohol. In addition, CIT's may not be in the presence of, or involved in any way with individuals possessing or consuming drugs and/or alcohol. Breach of this or any camp rules or regulations will result in dismissal from camp without fee refund. Please remember that this is not a glorified camper experience and only those who seriously want to take on responsibility ought to apply.

RELATIONSHIPS WITH STAFF

CIT's may not have relationships of a sexual nature with camp staff.

CIGARETTE SMOKING POLICY

CIT's are **not** permitted to smoke at anytime throughout the summer. Breach of this policy may result in dismissal from camp without fee refund.

PHONES AND CELL PHONES

CIT's may **not** have or use cell phones or any phones throughout the summer (unless given permission by a camp director).

VISITORS

CIT's are **not** permitted to be visited by family or friends at anytime throughout the summer except on the scheduled camp Visitors Day, Saturday, July 24, 2010. In addition, CIT's may not leave camp for any reason without the permission of the camp Director.

INTERVIEW

A personal interview for all applicants will be arranged at the Toronto office; this is usually scheduled at a convenient time after school hours and conducted in small groups of 4 or 5. The same concern and care will be taken in screening CIT's as we do when considering staff applicants.

Complete and return the enclosed application along with a deposit and arrange references as directed. You will be contacted to set up your CIT Interview. The CIT fee is \$7,100.00 plus laundry, taxes and an additional \$325.00 for CIT excursions.
